### Draught

The Capital Ale House is proud to feature 30 beers on tap at our main bar, 16 beers in the Gameroom downstairs, and 2 cask conditioned "real" ales. It is our intention to present only the finest beers available on draft. Look for seasonal and specialty beers to be rotated throughout the year as they become available. All of our draft beer is served in glassware traditional for the style.

#### CASK CONDITIONED ALES

The way beer used to be before refrigeration and forced carbonation! The freshest beer possible served at cellar temperature (50 - 55 degrees) via hand pump and in the traditional English Imperial Pint Glass. Ask your server which ones are available now.

**Cask- St. George IPA- Hampton VA - ABV 5%** - ... A traditional English style india pale ale with a distinct hop spiciness from imported 100% UK Fuggles hops.

**Cask- Victory Brewing- Storm King Stout-Pennsylvania-ABV- 9.1%** ... With a huge, Pacific Northwest hop aroma & character upfront, Storm King subsides into massive, roast malt complexity. More flavor than mere words can adequately describe. Rich and substantial, it will warm your heart.

#### Cider

- ➔ **Cider- Fox Barrel- Pear Cider- California- 4.5%** ... a dryer, soft bodied cider which is light and refreshing. It's an excellent candidate in situations where you might consider a dry Gewurtztraminer or champagne. Excellent with fruits, cheeses and salads, this light beverage is also a great brunch choice.

- ↗ **Belgian (Strong)- Ommegang Gnommegang- New York-ABV-9.5%** ... This delectable blonde ale is a co-creation of two famed farmstead breweries: Brewery Ommegang and Brasserie d'Achouffe. It employs five fine malts, two noble hops, and both of the distinctive Chouffe and Ommegang yeasts.
- ↗ **Belgian (Strong)- The Bruery 4 Calling Birds- California- ABV 11%** ... Belgian style dark ale brewed with spices. The fourth verse of our Twelve Beers of Christmas saga incorporates gingerbread-like spice into a rich and robust dark ale.
- ➔ **Belgian (Triple)- Victory Brewing Golden Monkey- Pennsylvania- ABV 9.5%** ... This golden frothy ale boasts an intriguing herbal aroma, firm bodied to the finish.
- Belgian (Triple/Imperial)- Van Steenberge Gulden Draak- Belgium- ABV 10.5%** - ... It is a "thick" beer, that you can actually "eat" to adventure the complex taste. Gulden Draak balances a natural malt toffee-like sweetness with a mellow happiness and some hoppy accents. The aroma is round & sweet.

- Bock- Schneider- Nelson Sauvign- Germany- ABV 7.3%** ... Brewed in 2011 exclusively to celebrate the 25th anniversary of the ABT cafes in Holland. A complex bottle-refermented wheat.
- ★ **Brown Ale (Local)- Legend Brewing Brown - Virginia- ABV 6%** ... Classic English Brown Ale. This full bodied beer is brewed with carmel and roasted malts then hopped with Mount Hood and Tettnang hops.
- **Brown Ale- Cigar City- Maduro Oatmeal Brown Ale- Florida- ABV 5.5%** ... A hearty brown ale that benefits from the silky mouthfeel provided by oatmeal, pairs great with Cigars.
- Fruit Beer- Cherish- Framboise Lambic- Belgium- ABV 5%** ... Ripe delicious raspberry with just a bit of a tart finish
- **IPA- Bells Two Hearted Ale- Michigan- ABV 7%-** ... India Pale Ale style well suited for Hemingway-esque trips to the Upper Peninsula. American malts and enormous hop additions give this beer a crisp finish and incredible floral hop aroma.
- ★ **IPA- Samuel Adams- Latitude 48-Massachusetts- ABV 6%** ... Samuel Adams Latitude 48 Ahtanum IPA is brewed with only Ahtanum hops, a newer variety from the Yakima Valley area of WA. The hops are added at three points during the brewing process -- bittering, late kettle and dry hopping. Ahtanum hops contribute a balanced and typically "American" orange peel, piney and floral flavor and aroma to this brew, balanced by a slight sweetness and full body from the five different malts.
- **IPA (Black)- Laughing Dog Dogzilla- Black IPA- Idaho- ABV 6.9%** ... Formerly Tail Wagger Black IPA. A true Northwest IPA with a big hop presence and a dark malt twist in the finish. 68.4IBU
- **IPA (Imperial)- Weyerbacher Simcoe Double IPA- Pennsylvania- ABV 9%** ... A fantastic flavor profile abounding with citrusy-grapefruit, piney, resinous notes that pushes this Double IPA over the top.
- ★ **Lager (Local)- Legend Brewing Lager- Virginia- ABV 4.5%** ... Made from 100% malted barley giving it a malty aroma and medium light body. The addition of Hallertau and Saaz hops add a subtle balance.
- ★ **Pale Ale- Victory Headwaters- Pennsylvania-ABV-5.2%** ... Victory is bringing the hops, malt and yeast in harmony, with our great local water as the conductor in Headwaters Pale Ale.
- Pilsner- Pilsner Urquell- Czech Republic- ABV 4.4%** ... It is called the "model of meter" among beers. All other pilsners are a better or worse attempt to copy the original - the first ever Pilsner Urquell.
- **Porter- Breckenridge- Vanilla Porter- Colorado- ABV-4.7%- 12oz** ... An ale that has all the chocolate and roasted nut flavor of a classic Porter, with an enigmatic surprise thrown in for good measure, real vanilla bean. Breckenridge Brewery's Vanilla Porter. A vanilla kiss in a rich, dark sea.
- **Seasonal- Anderson Valley- Winter Solstice -California- ABV 6.9 %** ... It begins with a very high original gravity to create a hearty and spicy brew with a deep amber hue and a smooth finish. Amber ale drinkers beware this will become your new favorite beer.
- ★ **Seasonal- Harpoon- Winter Warmer- Massachusetts- ABV 5.5%** ... A full-bodied rich ale that uses a touch of cinnamon and nutmeg to achieve its spirited flavor. Perfect for the holidays!
- Seasonal- St. Bernardus- Christmas Edition- Belgium- ABV 10%** ... St. Bernardus Christmas Ale is the youngest descendant in the illustrious family of delicious Abbey Ales by Brewery St. Bernardus. This specialty beer of 10% alc. vol. is characterized by its deep dark colour, with a creamy, thick head and a full, almost velvety taste with a fruity nose. It's a seasonal ale, brewed annually for the holiday season.
- **Seasonal- Troegs Mad Elf- 2007, 2008, 2010, or 2011- Pennsylvania- ABV 11%** ... The combination of Cherries, Honey, and Chocolate Malts delivers gentle fruits and subtle spices. Fermented and aged with a unique yeast, this ruby red beer has significant warming strength that underlies the character of this Ale.
- Stout- Guinness Irish Stout- Ireland- ABV 4.1%** ... Ingredients: Pale ale malt, about 25 to 30% flaked barley, and about 10% roasted barley, with no other grains or sugars; several hop varieties, mainly Goldings (pellets and isomerized extract); a flocculent head-forming ale yeast.
- **Stout (Imperial/Oaked)- Laughing Dog Bourbon Barrel Aged The Dogfather Imperial Stout- Idaho-ABV-10.85%**
- **White- Allagash White- Maine-ABV 5.5%** ... Allagash White delicately balances full flavor with a crisp, refreshing taste and subtle hints of spice. Naturally cloudy.
- ★ **Wheat- Abita Purple Haze- Louisiana-ABV 4.75%** ... A crisp wheat beer flavored with raspberries producing a subtle coloration and haze, fruity aroma and a tart yet sweet taste.
- Wheat- Hacker Pschorr Weisse- Germany- ABV 5.5%** ... Hackers-Pschorr's unfiltered wheat smooth with hints of bannana and citrus.
- Wheat- Schneider Weisse- Germany- ABV5.4%** ... Fairly dark compared to most other hefeweizens. Deep orange and hazy. Nice head. Great hefe aroma of clove and fruit. Taste is slightly bitter and very dry. A great example of the German brewing at its best!

- ✓ **Belgian (Strong)- North Coast- Brother Thelonious -California- ABV 9%** ... Jazz icon Thelonious Monk is the inspiration for North Coast Brewing's new Belgian-style abbey ale which is rich and robust with an ABV of 9%
- Belgian (Triple)- Troubadour Magma- Belgium- ABV 9%** ... This is a celebration of American hops! The brewer is featuring the Cascade hop in this Magma 2011 edition of the award winning Troubadour Magma, which features Simcoe hops. You will find a new Magma edition every year beginning in October while supplies last.
- **IPA (Imperial)- Dogfish Head 90 Minute-Delaware- ABV 9%** ... What you have here is a India Pale Ale featuring a single, constant 90 minute hop addition of Warrior, Simcoe, and Amarillo hops. It's balanced by a ridiculous amount of English two-row barley. Then they dry-hop it in every tank.
- **Limited Edition- Stone/Bruery/Elysian- La Citrueille Cèleste de Citracado- California- ABV 5%** ... Ale brewed with pumpkin, yams, toasted fenugreek, lemon verbena and birch bark.
- **Scotch- Bear Republic- Heritage Ale- California- ABV 7.6%** ... This beer is fermented at a lower temperature than our standard ales, giving it a very malty taste. Scottish and English malts are melded together with English hops to create this ale's strong, sweet, malty finish. The caramel color comes from a blending of 3 types of Scottish and English crystal malts. The hops are UK Kent Goldings, but only in small amounts, so that the malt flavor still comes through.
- ★ **Stout- Tallgrass- Buffalo Sweat- Kansas-ABV-5%** ... What we really like about this beer is the smoothness that brewing with cream sugar brings to the palate. This smoothness balances out the copious quantities of roasted barley used in the brewing process to create a rich, complex, and delicious beer. I

- ★ **Amber Ale- HeBrew- Genesis Ale- New York- ABV 6%** ... Crisp, smooth and perfectly balanced between a west coast style pale and amber ale, with a supple malt sweetness and a pronounced hop flourish.
- ★ **Amber Ale- New Belgium Fat Tire- Colorado- ABV 5.2%** ... - ★ **Brown Ale (Local)- St. George Brown Ale - ABV 5.4 %** ... This is a smooth brown ale that is very full bodied and refreshing. Order a glass and don't share. Don't even tell your friends you have found your new favorite beer. Be selfish!
- ➔ **IPA- Bear Republic Racer 5- California- ABV 7%** ... This is a full bodied beer using American grains. The goal was to create a base for showing off the unique floral qualities of two Pacific Northwest hops, Columbus and Cascade.
- ★ **IPA (Rye)- Laughing Dog- Rocket Dog- Idaho- ABV 6.9%** ... No wonder there's a hop shortage. Brewed special for the OBF, Rocket Dog launches four types of hops at five different intervals into this brew. Roasted barley and rye, pale and Munich malts give this beer a red tint. Fermented a little on the dry side, this thirst-quencher is a hop lover's dream.
- ➔ **IPA (Imperial)- He'brew- Lenny Bruce R.I.P.A- New York- ABV 10%** ... Commemorating the 40th Anniversary of the death of Lenny Bruce: A Rye based double IPA. Brewed with an obscene amount of malts and hops. Shocking flavors - Far beyond contemporary community standards.
- ★ **Lager- Dogfish Head- Lawn Mower- Delaware- ABV 4.3%** ... Lawnmower is our intro for those who need a little help jumping feet first into the crazy world that is Dogfish Head beer. It's a starter beer, but it's not dumbed down. Lawnmower is made with quality ingredients and is a great thirst quencher - perfect to enjoy after a day in the sun mowing the lawn (or anything else that gets you hot and bothered)!
- ➔ **Lager- Kona- Longboard- Hawaii- ABV 5.5%** ... Longboard Lager is a smooth refreshing lager fermented and aged for five weeks at cold temperatures to yield its exceptionally smooth flavor. A delicate, slightly spicy hop aroma complements the malty body of this beer

## American Strong Ales

American Strong Ales are hard to define and are similar to Belgian Strong Ale in that the style itself is made up of beers that cannot be thrown into any other category other than strong. They may be dark or amber in malt, highly hopped or super sweet. Their main defining feature is that they are high alcohol, defiant to all present styles, and 100% American in their creation.

## Barley Wines and English Strong Ales

### BARLEY WINE

Barley Wine was originally defined as the strongest brew being created by an English brewery. Coined in the earlier 20th century to show strong beer as a potential substitute for wine in reference to strength and complexity. Now Barley Wine has become its own style, though diverse in its variety.

Some are high hopped, others dark malted and sweet. ABV can range from 6%- 18%. English Strong Ales and Old Ales are hard to separate from Barley Wines in definition and history but modern versions even in the US tend to lean towards the English, less hopped, higher ABV direction

## Belgian & Belgian Style Ales

Belgian Ales represent the height of the brewers' art. Sophisticated brewing techniques, yeast blends and unique flavoring elements have elevated the beers of Belgium to the status enjoyed by wine in other countries.

### BLONDE ALES

As a style single malted ales or table beer are put into this category, however, some triples and high ABV brews also call themselves blonde ales. The basic reason any beer has blonde on the label is because of its coloring. Belgian Blondes are called such because of their usage of lighter malt.

Belgian dubbels are always dark malted. The style was originated by the Trappist brewery of Westmalle. The style of dubbel will range between 7-8% ABV and usually be the second highest in gravity and alcohol content a Belgian brewery will produce. (See also Belgian Dark)

**GOLDEN & PALE ALES**

The original Belgian Golden was created by DUVEL. The light body, bright crisp flavor, and high ABV of Duvel, have become so popular that many breweries attempt to emulate it. The effect is the creation of the style itself. Breweries often have demonic names adorning the labels in homage of the great Duvel.

**TRIPLELS**

The first Triple ever created is from the Trappist brewery, Westmalle. They are distinguishable from Golden Ales through their unfiltered nature. Triples can be triple fermented or use three types of malt, or both. They are hazy, creamy in mouth feel; they have high ABV and are usually light malted.

## Porters

Dark, full-bodied ale. Porters can range from a London style (almost reddish in color with a mildly thin body) to a Scotch Porter (that is black, dark and roasty). Porters have a diverse history, being at one time the most heavily exported beer in the world, then shortly after almost completely extinct. The famous beer writer Micheal Jackson spent his career researching the style porter. It is thought to be the origin of stouts, mild ales, and even sour Flemish reds. Porters are a mysterious brew that began as the favorite beer of the street porters of London in the 18th century, and expanded to include popularity in the Russian Imperial Court. (See also Stout)

## Stouts

The origin of the style of Stout is the same as Porter. The title "stout" was an English term at one time attached to any style of beer that was a bit heavier or higher in ABV. Porters, being one of the most popular styles of 18th century England, were brewed with many variations. Lighter versions were known as mild-porters, darker heavier ones were called stout-porters. During the 20th century the term porter was dropped completely and the style was simply known as Stout. Stouts are dark beers but they can range from low alcohol and gravity to extremely high. (See also Porter or Belgian Stout sections)

Sweet Stouts are sweeter than their Irish cousins. Many of them have lactose sugars added since yeast doesn't ferment them out. The use of lactose (milk) sugars are the reason for the addition of the "Milk" or "Cream" title to the style.

### KRYSTAL WHEAT (Filtered)

Wheat beers are notoriously hard to filter because of the heavy amount of protein that wheat brings to a beer style. Krystal weiss is a style more popular in Austria than Germany though it is gaining popularity amongst US brewers. The beer has the appearance of a light lager but usually has the subtle spicy and fruitiness of a hefe.
