### Draught

The Capital Ale House is proud to feature 51 beers on tap at our main bar, 12 beers at our upper bar, 2 cask conditioned "real" ales, and an additional 12 drafts located at our outside bar as weather permits. It is our intention to present only the finest beers available on draft. Look for seasonal and specialty beers to be rotated throughout the year as they become available. All of our draft beers are served in traditional glassware. Enjoy!

#### CASK CONDITIONED ALE

The way beer used to be before refrigeration and forced carbonation! The freshest beer possible served at cellar temperature (50 - 55 degrees) via hand pump and in the traditional English Imperial Pint Glass. Ask your server which ones are available now.

**Cask- Victory Brewing- Hop Devil Ale- Pennsylvania- ABV 6.7 %** ... Bold, spicy and menacingly delicious, this American-hopped India Pale Ale offers an aromatic punch and then follows through with a lasting, full-bodied finish.

**Cask- Victory Brewing- Storm King Stout-Pennsylvania-ABV- 9.1%** ... With a huge, Pacific Northwest hop aroma & character upfront, Storm King subsides into massive, roast malt complexity. More flavor than mere words can adequately describe. Rich and substantial, it will warm your heart.

#### CIDER

- **Cider- Ace Pear- California- ABV 5%** ... Made from a base of 100% pure, local apple juice. Pear essence is added to give the cider its distinctive pear taste
- **Cider- Crispin- Natural Hard Apple Cider- Minnesota-ABV- 6.5%** ... Crisp refreshing natural hard apple cider. Crisp over ice. A classically styled, but untraditional hard apple cider.

#### SEASONAL & LIMITED EDITION DRAFT

- **Limited Edition- Brooklyn Brewing- Companion- New York- ABV 10%** ... Richly textured, this Wheatwine beer resembles a big Belgian Pale Ale. While retaining its mouthfeel until deep in finish, a linger of breadly sweetness, fruit, and spice lasts well into the next sip.
- ↙ **Limited Edition- Dogfish Head- Midas Touch- Delaware- ABV 9%** ... This beverage based on the residue found on the drinking vessels in King Midas' tomb. Our recipe highlights the known ingredients of barley, white Muscat grapes, honey and saffron. A combination of flavors suggesting a mix of beer, wine, and mead. .

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→ **Seasonal- New Belgium- Kick- Colorado- ABV 8.5%** ... We get a kick out of collaborating. Harvesting the creativity of Kim Jordan of New Belgium and Dick Cantwell of Elysian produced this ruby-hued, slightly sour, pumpkin, cranberry ale. It's a treat that does the trick.

**Seasonal- Nogne O Winter Ale- Norway- ABV 8.5%** ... A dark ale brewed specially for the Christmas season, with a rich, complex taste of caramel. This is a strong, dark and rather sweet Christmas Beer – just the way we think a Christmas beer should be.

★ **Seasonal- Victory Summer Love- Pennsylvania- ABV 5.5%** ... Summer of Love Ale is a golden ale made with pale malts, German hops and Brandywine River water. This specific style of beer was chosen because it has a broad appeal and will be accessible for casual beer drinkers, but will still retain exciting hop notes.

#### MAIN BAR DRAFT ORGANIZED BY STYLE

★ **Amber Ale- New Belgium Fat Tire- Colorado- ABV 5.2%** ... Named in honor of our founder Jeff's bike trip through Belgium, Fat Tire Amber Ale marks a turning point in the young electrical engineer's home brewing. Fat Tire won fans in its sense of balance: toasty, biscuit-like malt flavors coasting in equilibrium with hoppy freshness.

★ **Amber Ale (Local)- Starr Hill Amber Ale- Virginia- ABV 5.4%** ... Brewed in the tradition of the great English ales, its rich honey color hints at its smooth, caramel flavoring. With a medium body and slightly sweet finish.

→ **American Strong- Lagunitas- Lucky #13- California-ABV 8.9%** ... From the first day of the first mash of the first recipe in the first brewhouse in the first space to this oasis 13 years on the road; We have worked hard to walk in the footsteps of our hero brewers

→ **American Strong- Stone Brewing- Arrogant Bastard Ale - California- ABV 7.1%** ... This is an aggressive beer. You probably won't like it. It is quite doubtful that you have the taste or sophistication to appreciate an ale of this quality and depth (however, your chances are greatly increased if you have good enough taste to be in this establishment).

↗ **Barley Wine- Laughing Dog- 14 Dogs- Idaho- ABV 13%**

→ **Belgian (Saison)- Epic- Sour Apple Saison- Utah- ABV 8.1%** ... There may not be a more perfect summer ale. Sweet, yet dry and tart, apples spiced with coriander, grains of paradise, anise, nutmeg, cloves, cinnamon, cardamom, ginger. Whether enjoying ice cold under the hot June sun or pairing with a light dinner as the sunsets into the evening, there is no wrong way to enjoy this Saison Belgian Style Farmhouse Ale!

→ **Belgian (Strong/Local)- Port City- Tidings- Virginia- ABV 7.8%** ... Ale brewed with honey and spices.

→ **Belgian (Triple)- Bells- Sparkling Ale- Michigan- ABV 9%** ... Sparkling Ale is an American Triple, fermented with both Trappist and Belgian yeast. The result is a golden, malty ale, high in alcohol with a fruity nose, a rich ester profile and tart finish.

**Belgian (Triple)- Chimay Cinq Cent- Belgium- ABV 10%** ... This special trappist is much like a Belgian tripel in style. Light golden in color with a champagne like head. Fruity notes of muscat and raisins that give this beer a particularly attractive aroma. There is no acidity, but an after-bitterness which melts in the mouth. Sweet and sour on the taste buds but with a neat dry finish.

→ **Belgian (Triple)- Victory Brewing Golden Monkey- Pennsylvania- ABV 9.5%** ... This golden frothy ale boasts an intriguing herbal aroma, firm bodied to the finish.

**Bock (Dopple)- Paulaner- Salvator- Germany- ABV 7.9%** ... The Paulaner Salvator with its strong, typically malty taste is the original Paulaner. Its recipe today is almost the same as it was in 1773.

→ **Brown Ale- Rogue- Hazelnut Brown -Oregon- ABV 6.2%** ... Dark brown in color with a hazelnut aroma, a rich nutty flavor and a smooth malty finish. Hazelnut Brown Nectar Ale is a blend of Great Western 2-row Pale, Munich, Hugh Baird Brown, Crystal 80 and Crystal 135, Carastan, and Beeston Pale Chocolate malts; hazelnut extract; Perle and Saaz hops.

★ **Brown Ale- Sierra Nevada- Tumbler Autumn- California- ABV-5.5%** ... Two-row pale, crystal 40, chocolate and smoked malts give it a malty complexity. Challenger hops in the boil add balancing bitterness, while more Challengers and some Goldings give just enough hop flavor in the finish to balance all that malt.

**English Bitter- Bass Ale- England- ABV 4.4%** ... A Classic English ale. For hundreds of years, the traditional English pub has offered an irresistible combination of fine ale and warm welcome. Bass Ale comes from the very heart of this tradition.

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- Flemish Sour- Bavik- Petrus Aged Pale- Belgium- ABV 7.3%** ... A pale barley-malt beer, aged two years in large oak casks first used for white wine and Calvados (apple brandy). It's lightly malty, with a faint sweetness and a lingering sour edge.
- Fruit Beer- Lindeman's Framboise (Raspberry) Lambic-Belgium- ABV 2.5%** ... Naturally fermented beer. Developed by Lindemans brewery using straight juice-method. The result is a fresh fruity drink with the background of the rich bouquet of Lambic. The rich luxurious taste of fresh raspberries in a bottle. A clean natural tasting Lambic with a wonderful aroma.
- ★ **Fruit Beer- Shiner Ruby Redbird- Texas- ABV 4.2%** ... Brewed with genuine Texas Rio Red Grapefruit, the signature sweet citrus of the Rio Grande Valley, and ginger. This lager beer features grapefruit tartness and finishes with a 'lil kick of ginger.
- ➔ **IPA- Bells Two Hearted Ale- Michigan- ABV 7%**- ... India Pale Ale style well suited for Hemingway-esque trips to the Upper Peninsula. American malts and enormous hop additions give this beer a crisp finish and incredible floral hop aroma.
- ★ **IPA- Sierra Nevada- Torpedo Extra IPA- California- ABV 7.2%** ... Torpedo is an assertive American IPA deep reddish-gold in color, with a smooth and breadly malt presence and over-the-top hop aromas. The beer has a solid bitterness and a massive hop flavor, yet remains easy drinking with a pleasant dry finish.
- ➔ **IPA (Black)- Laughing Dog Dogzilla- Black IPA- Idaho- ABV 6.9%** ... Formerly Tail Wagger Black IPA. A true Northwest IPA with a big hop presence and a dark malt twist in the finish. 68.4IBU
- ★ **IPA (Rye)- Laughing Dog- Rocket Dog- Idaho- ABV 6.9%** ... No wonder there's a hop shortage. Brewed special for the OBF, Rocket Dog launches four types of hops at five different intervals into this brew. Roasted barley and rye, pale and Munich malts give this beer a red tint. Fermented a little on the dry side, this thirst-quencher is a hop lover's dream.
- Kolsch- Reissdorf Kolsch- Germany- ABV 4.8%** ... A light crisp flavor with a nice malt aroma. Pours a very clear pale yellow color with nice lacing. All around this is a well built kolsch that is very flavorful yet refreshing at the same time.
- ★ **Lager- Bells- Lager of the Lakes- Michigan- ABV 4.5%** ... Bell's Beer uses a Bohemian-lager yeast culture, high-grade European malts, and of course, Czech Saaz hops. Keeping with tradition, the deep golden, pilsner will lager for two months before being served.
- ➔ **Lager- Kona- Longboard- Hawaii- ABV 5.5%** ... Longboard Lager is a smooth refreshing lager fermented and aged for five weeks at cold temperatures to yield its exceptionally smooth flavor. A delicate, slightly spicy hop aroma complements the malty body of this beer
- Lager- Harp Irish Lager- Ireland- ABV 4.3%** ... Bright golden; fruity nose; crisp and clean, slightly bitter up front, smooth aftertaste.
- Lager- Paulaner Original - Germany- ABV 5%** ... When the Original Münchner was brewed for the first time at the end of the 19th Century, it was a spectacular success. With its slight hoppy taste, subtle, light and elegant, it becomes ever popular.
- ★ **Lager- Yuengling- Traditional Lager- Pennsylvania ABV 4.9%**- ... Has a deep amber color and a mild hop character. Oldest brewery in America making one of the smoothest drinkable lagers.
- ★ **Lager (Amber)- Samuel Adams Boston Lager - Massachusettes- ABV 4.75%** ... Golden amber color; Hoppy, floral aroma, malty, slightly sweet with a dry, complex finish
- ★ **Lager (Black)- New Belgium- 1554 Enlightened Black Ale- Colorado- ABV 5.6%** ... Born of a flood and centuries-old Belgian text, 1554 Enlightened Black Ale uses a light lager yeast strain and dark chocolaty malts to redefine what dark beer can be.
- ★ **Lager (Local)- Legend Brewing Lager- Virginia- ABV 4.5%** ... Made from 100% malted barley giving it a malty aroma and medium light body. The addition of Hallertau and Saaz hops add a subtle balance.
- ★ **Pale Ale- Magic Hat #9 Not Quite Pale Ale- Vermont- ABV 5.1%** ... An ale whose mysterious and unusual palate will swirl across your tongue and ask more questions than it answers. A beer brewed clandestinely and given a name whose meaning is never revealed.
- ★ **Pale Ale- Sierra Nevada Pale Ale - California- ABV 5.6%** ... This beer has a deep amber color and an exceptionally full body, complex character.

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- Pilsner- Bitburger Pils - Germany- ABV 4.8% ...** Pale in color with a crisp hoppy aroma. A full bodied pilsener that is one of Germany's best!
- ★ **Pilsner (Local)- Legend Brewing Pilsner -Virginia- ABV 5.8% ...** Deep gold in color with a firm malty background, assertively hopped. This Richmond beer is dry hopped for additional aroma..
- ★ **Porter- Saranac- Caramel Porter- New York- ABV 5.4% ...** Saranac Caramel Porter is a robust, flavorful porter reminiscent of a by-gone era. True to brewing tradition, we've used dark caramel malt as well as Fuggles & East Kent Goldings hops for a smooth, yet slightly bitter, roasted flavor. Look for hints of real caramel used in brewing this delicious brew.
- ➔ **Scottish (Style)- Oskar Blues Old Chub Scottish Ale- Colorado- ABV-8% ...** A high malted Scottish styled ale .A limited-release seasonal beer, Old Chub is a Scottish style ale brewed with copious amounts of crystal and chocolate malts, and a dash of beechwood-smoked malts.
- ★ **Stout- Dogfish Head- Chicory Stout- Delaware- ABV 5.2% ...** A rich, dark beer made with a touch of roasted chicory, organic Mexican coffee, St. John's Wort, and licorice root.
- Stout- Guinness Irish Stout- Ireland- ABV 4.1% ...** Ingredients: Pale ale malt, about 25 to 30% flaked barley, and about 10% roasted barley, with no other grains or sugars; several hop varieties, mainly Goldings (pellets and isomerized extract); a flocculent head-forming ale yeast.
- ➔ **Stout (Imperial)- Laughing Dog Dogfather- Idaho- ABV 10.85% ...** 7 malts and 4 hops give it a complex flavor profile. Over 11 month in the making some of the DogFather has been barrel aged.
- ★ **Wheat- Abita Purple Haze- Louisiana-ABV 4.75% ...** A crisp wheat beer flavored with raspberries producing a subtle coloration and haze, fruity aroma and a tart yet sweet taste.
- Wheat- Erdinger Weisse- Germany- ABV 5.3% ...** A premium Weissbier at the top of its class. Hazy golden body, thick creamy head. Erdinger is brewed strictly after the Bavarian purity requirements.
- ★ **Wheat (Local)- Starr Hill Love Weiss- Virginia- ABV 5% ...** Hazy gold in its color with hints of Banana and clove this summer specialty is one of the best American Heffe's we at the CAH have tasted. Enjoy.
- Wheat- Weihenstephaner Hefeweizen- Germany- ABV 5.4% ...** Nothing refreshes you more than this naturally cloudy wheat beer with its wonderful yeasty fragrance and taste. A great product from the oldest brewery in the world.
- White- Hoegaarden Wit - Belgium- ABV 5.1% ...** Unfiltered Belgian White, with hints of coriander and orange peel, creating a sweet & sour taste.
- ➔ **White- Ommegang- Witte- New York- ABV 5.1% ...** Ommegang Witte, a traditional Belgian-style wheat ale with whispers of sweet orange and a touch of tart lemon. Soft and seductive.

## UPSTAIRS BAR

- ★ **Amber Ale- Bells Amber- Michigan- ABV-6%** ... Made from mostly pale malt and some Munich and caramel malts. These add a little sweetness, which is balanced by more hops. The result is a rich color and fruity flavor.
- ★ **Brown Ale (Local)- Legend Brewing Brown - Virginia- ABV 6%** ... Classic English Brown Ale. This full bodied beer is brewed with caramel and roasted malts then hopped with Mount Hood and Tettnang hops.
- ➔ **IPA- Bear Republic Racer 5- California- ABV 7%** ... This is a full bodied beer using American grains. The goal was to create a base for showing off the unique floral qualities of two Pacific Northwest hops, Columbus and Cascade.
- ★ **IPA (Imperial)- Laughing Dog- AlphaDog Imperial IPA-Idaho- ABV 8%** ... ALPHADOG Imperial IPA 127 IBU's 8% abv AlphaDog Is their new year round Imperial IPA.
- ★ **Lager- Brooklyn Brewing- Lager- New York- ABV 5%** ... The Brewery's flagship label, is New York's "hometown" beer, brewed to a pre-Prohibition recipe that dates back to the days when Brooklyn was the brewing capital of the East Coast.
- Lager- Hofbrau Lager- Germany- ABV 5%** ... Pours a straw yellow color with an aroma of grain and malt. Flavor had some bread, malt and hops-with a touch of sweetness.
- Pilsner- Pilsner Urquell- Czech Republic- ABV 4.4%** ... It is called the "model of meter" among beers. All other pilsners are a better or worse attempt to copy the original - the first ever Pilsner Urquell.
- Stout- Young's Double Chocolate Stout- England- ABV 5%** ... A distinctive chocolate flavor with a smooth and velvety finish. Pale ale malt, crystal malt, roasted barley, chocolate malt, special blend of sugars, Fuggles and Goldings hops, real dark chocolate and chocolate essence.
- Wheat- Paulaner Hefeweizen - Germany- ABV 5.8%** ... High in effervescence and low in calories with a crisp, refreshing fruity flavor. A German tradition.
- Wheat (Bock)- Schneider Aventinus Weizen Doppel Bock- Germany- ABV 8%** ... Dark ruby, glistening mysteriously, streaked with fine, top-fermented yeast, this beer has a compact, stable and long-lasting head. Very full-bodied, compact and yet fresh with a hint of caramel.
- ➔ **White- Allagash White- Maine-ABV 5.5%** ... Allagash White delicately balances full flavor with a crisp, refreshing taste and subtle hints of spice. Naturally cloudy.

## PATIO BAR

- ➔ **Amber Ale- Anderson Valley Boont Amber Ale-California-ABV 5.8%** ... A medium-bodied pale ale with a beautiful copper color, a robust head, and the rich flavor of caramel malt.
- ★ **Pilsner- North Coast Scrimshaw Pils- California- ABV 5%** ... Named for the delicate engravings popularized by 19th century seafarers, Scrimshaw is a fresh tasting Pilsener brewed in the finest European tradition from Munich and Klages malts, Hallertauer and Tettnang hops. Scrimshaw has a subtle hop character, a crisp, clean palate, and a dry finish.

- ↗ **Stout (Imperial)- Oskar Blues- Ten Fidy- Colorado- ABV 9.4%** ... Ten FIDY Imperial stout is a titanic wonder of a stout, immensely viscous, and loaded with neck-deep flavors of chocolate, malt, coffee, cocoa and oats.
- Belgian (Blonde)- La Caracole- Saxo- Belgium- ABV 8%** ... Cloudy wheat color with elements of golden orange, with a thick skiff on top. Sweet wheaty yeast aroma. Very tasty brew, lots yeast, tons of wheat malt and the perfect sweetness.
- ➔ **Belgian (IPA)- Laughing Dog- St Benny's Hoppy Monk- Idaho- ABV 8%** ... 6th Anniversary Belgian IPA
- Belgian (Quad)- St. Bernardus ABT 12- Belgium- ABV 10%** ... Full bodied quadruple, creamy, fruity and with a great complexity. Hints of rasin and plum. Brown sugar and spice with a hint of licorice. It doesn't get much better as far as Belgian beers go.
- ↗ **Belgian (Strong)- Allagash Hugh Malone- Maine- ABV-8.5%** ... The base of the beer includes English two-row malt and pale crystal malts, establishing an understated sweetness. This 8.5 % ABV ale has a malty palate and a pronounced bitterness. It has a pleasant dry, hoppy finish.
- ↗ **Belgian (Strong)- Epic Brainless on Cherries- Utah- ABV 10.3%** ... We took our double gold medal winning Brainless Belgian, added cherry puree and aged it in French Chardonnay casks for a secondary fermentation in the barrels. Pours a beautiful deep ruby color with a medium white head. A nice nose of sweet cherries, Belgian malts, and barrel aging.
- ↗ **Belgian (Strong)- Ommegang Adoration- New York-ABV-10%** ... Adoration is a traditional winter ale, brewed in the Belgian manner, but with the twist of unusual spicing.
- ➔ **IPA (Imperial)- He'brew- Lenny Bruce R.I.P.A- New York- ABV 10%** ... Commemorating the 40th Anniversary of the death of Lenny Bruce: A Rye based double IPA. Brewed with an obscene amount of malts and hops. Shocking flavors - Far beyond contemporary community standards.
- ➔ **IPA (Imperial)- Victory- Yakima Twilight- Pennsylvania- ABV- 8.9%** ... The tenacious grip of big, juicy hop aroma and character slides smoothly into rich, dark malts. This heavyweight battle between fresh, Yakima Valley hops and dark, roasted malts is resolved harmoniously as the flavors merge to deliver complex satisfaction with a warming edge. Enjoy the 'twilight' for the bright and brassy hops!
- ➔ **IPA (Imperial/Local)- Starr Hill- Double Platinum- IPA- Virginia-ABV- 8%** ... Double the hops, double the fun! Double Platinum is dry hopped with Simcoe hops to achieve a very pungent citrus aroma and a well-balanced malt backbone.
- ★ **Pale Ale (Local)- Bull and Bones- The Lunch Pale Ale- Virginia- ABV 5.2%** ... This is Bull & Bones version of the classic California style pale ale. Beautiful amber in color with an abundance of premium Centennial hops that lend a distinctive spicy flavor and fragrant bouquet.

## Barley Wines & English Strong Ale

This style is often compared to wine in its complexity.

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## Porters

Dark, full-bodied ale. Porters can range from a London style (almost reddish in color with a mildly thin body) to a Scotch Porter (that is black, dark and roasty). Porters have a diverse history, being at one time the most heavily exported beer in the world, then shortly after almost completely extinct. The famous beer writer Micheal Jackson spent his career researching the style porter. It is thought to be the origin of stouts, mild ales, and even sour Flemish reds. Porters are a mysterious brew that began as the favorite beer of the street porters of London in the 18th century, and expanded to include popularity in the Russian Imperial Court. (See also Stout)

This style often is called a Scotch Export. High ABV made it a beer that could make long journeys during English colonialism. McEwen's is considered the pinnacle of the style. Scottish exports are known for being rich and malty with sweet caramel and toffee notes. The style is also referred to often when analyzing the origin of many Belgian strong ales. ( See also Belgian Dubbles & Belgian dark ales)

### SCOTTISH STYLE

A rejuvenation of small breweries in Scotland during the Nineties brought with it an exploration for more traditional Scottish brews. Through old found recipes and scrapings of beer vessels in Scottish tombs styles that had not seen the light of day for hundreds of years were adapted and recreated. A gruit is a modern term for a beer that does not have hops. The beers below are new brews based on old styles of Scottish gruits that used fruit, herbs, or spices instead of hops.

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## Smoked / Rauchbiers

Rauchbiers are a German style of beer mostly brewed in the Bamberg area. They use grain that has been smoked during the malting process. The result is a brew that can range from slightly smoky in flavor to overwhelmingly smoky. The US also uses smoked malts in many styles of beers. Peat smoked Scottish-style ales and smoked porters being two common American varieties.

## Stouts

The origin of the style of Stout is the same as Porter. The title "stout" was an English term at one time attached to any style of beer that was a bit heavier or higher in ABV. Porters, being one of the most popular styles of 18th century England, were brewed with many variations. Lighter versions were known as mild-porters, darker heavier ones were called stout-porters. During the 20th century the term porter was dropped completely and the style was simply known as Stout. Stouts are dark beers but they can range from low alcohol and gravity to extremely high. (See also Porter or Belgian Stout sections)

### OATMEAL, SWEET , MILK AND CREAM STOUT

Also known as nourishing stouts. These styles are English derived and really came to their popular height after World War II as healthy beer alternatives. Their reign was short lived and these styles almost entirely disappeared from the beer world. Sam Smith in conjunction with Micheal Jackson is given credit as reviving the style of Oatmeal stout in the 1970's. Oatmeal is thought to bring a smooth creamy quality to the beer. Sweet Stouts are sweeter than their Irish cousins. Many of them have lactose sugars added since yeast doesn't ferment them out. The use of lactose (milk) sugars are the reason for the addition of the "Milk" or "Cream" title to the style.

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**IMPERIAL STOUT**

Also known as Russian Imperial Stout because of its origin as an English export item to Russia and other Baltic nations. The popular style of Porter was exported from England all over the world during the 18th century. In order to make the cold voyage north through the Baltic Sea, the beers alcohol content was increased to detour freezing. The vodka drinking Imperial Russian court of Catherine the II took an immediate shine to this strong beer and it took the name of Imperial Stout-Porter. Today the term porter has been completely dropped from the style. It is at times referred to as an export or foreign stout. (See also Baltic Porter section)

## Wheat Beers

A refreshing beer made with at least 30% wheat malt. Those made with a German yeast strain tend to have hints of bananas, spice, vanilla and citrus. American yeast usually brings an easier to drink but less complex flavor profile. The Germans usually put weiss (white) or wiezen (wheat) on their beer labels. They have the same meaning when describing the style. Belgians have their own version of wheat ale that has coriander and orange peel added to the brewing process (See also Belgian White Ale)

### HEFE WHEAT (Unfiltered)

Hefe or unfiltered wheat ales are by far the most popular of the wheat style. Unfiltered wheat beers can be hazy because of yeast still present in the bottle and wheat proteins. So despite the cloudy appearance, un-filtered wheat beers (Hefe Wiezen) are low carb and amazingly good for you.

### DUNKLE WHEAT (Dark Malted)

Dark malted wheat beers usually have the title of Dunkle attached to the name. However their are beers in the wheat family named "ur" or "original" this refers to an older style of Weiss beer that has a dark amber malt profile. There are also wheat beers known as weizen bock or weizen-dopplebock that would also be dark malted but higher in ABV. (See also Bock/Weizen Bock)

### BERLINER WEISS/ KRYSTAL WEISSE

Wheat beers are notoriously hard to filter because of the heavy amount of protein that wheat brings to a beer style. Krystal weiss is a style more popular in Austria than Germany though it is gaining popularity amongst US brewers. The beer has the appearance of a light lager but usually has the subtle spicy and fruitiness of a hefe. There is another filtered wheat beer from Germany known as Berliner Weiss. Berliner is rare but originally from Berlin. The style has lactic acid added to the beer making it very tart. Fruit syrups are also often added to this style after pouring which sweetens it up and lowers the ABV.
